Northern Warfare Challenge is a 3rd Brigade ROTC competition that takes place in La Crosse, WI. 5-member teams ruck along a course which is no less than 22 miles long, and they must negotiate winter elements and thousands of feet in elevation. Along the course, they test their survival skills by starting a fire, using various weapons such as the bow and arrow, and pull a designated casualty in a SKEDCO. Only 3 teams finished among the 20+ who competed, and the GEB team, lead by CDT Jonathan Still, took home 2nd place!

This year, the GEB men's team place in the top 8, while the women's team earned a spot in the top 4!

Cadets Plaza and Young finished in the top 5 in the female category, with times of 3:42:14 and 3:46:25, respectively. Ranger Challenge Sandhurst

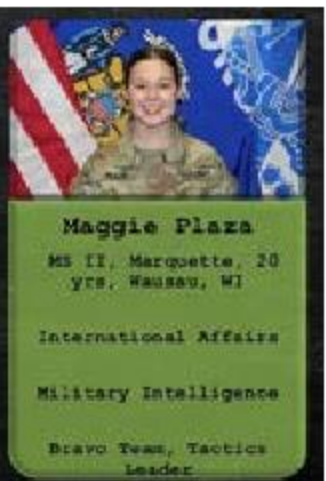
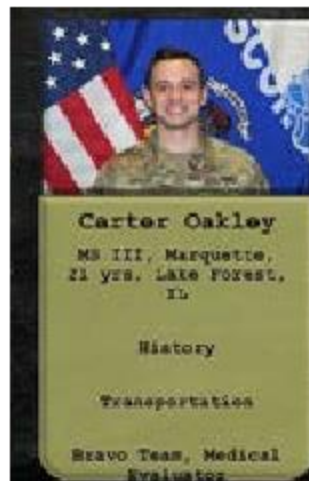
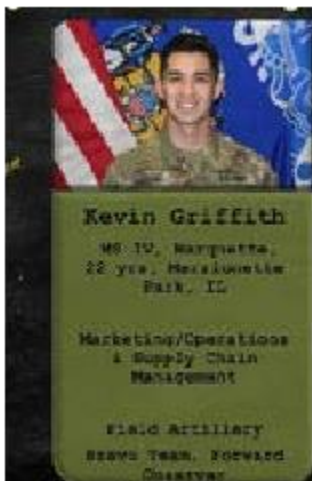
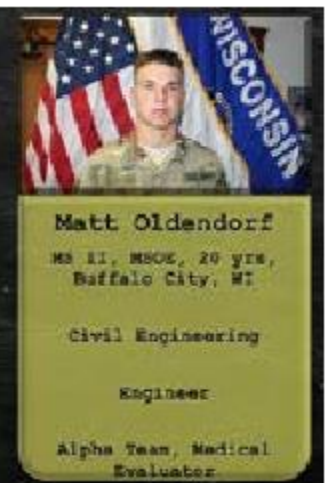
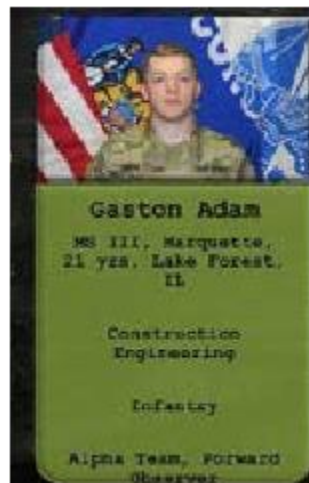
The Sandhurst Military Skills Competition is the world's premier military academy competition. Academies from across the world travel to the United States Military Academy at West Point to test their physical fitness and mental resilience as they navigate over 30 miles of the surrounding training grounds. Such skills as marksmanship (with multiple weapon systems), land navigation, and zodiac boat rowing test the officer candidates from different countries and services. 48 teams from across the US and the world competed here. The GEB was able to measure itself against various USMA teams, the Australians, Danish, Japanese, Chilean, etc. from their military academies.

Words from the PMS

Friends, Family and Alumni of our Golden Eagle Battalion,

What an amazing year. I write this in the passing hours after the Class of 2019 commissioned into the force.

It is truly amazing how quickly these young men and women develop and are on stage, taking the oath of commission. The Class of 2019 made incredible impact on our Army ROTC program and lead our 128 Cadet element to real success. After a Task Force sweep in Wisconsin, and a 1st Place Finish at the 3d Brigade Ranger Challenge in November 2018, our program was invited to send 11 x Cadets to the Sandhurst 2019 International Competition at West Point. The Golden Eagle Battalion finished 14th of 49 of the world's best as teams representing the U.S. Service Academies, and other Cadets from countries like Norway, Japan, Greece, Mexico, South Korea, United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand also sent their best. Of the `16 Army ROTC programs that competed in Sandhurst 2019, our Cadets managed a 2d place finish. Quite an astounding feat considering the top notch international and national competition and skill level. As a result of our strong showing in Ranger Challenge, Northern Warfare Competition, Buddy Ranger, and Sandhurst, our program was awarded the Brigade Commander's Cup, signifying that we are the top program in the Midwest!

With official analysis complete, Marquette Army ROTC and the Golden Eagle Battalion have ranked in the top 11% of Army ROTC programs across the country! This ranking takes into account the overall cadet in terms of cumulative GPA, physical fitness test scores, extra-cur-

ricular activities, Advanced Camp performance, and leadership potential. Thank you to everyone for your support! It really makes a difference!

We are projecting a large commissioning class for next year as the Class of 2020 could see us commission over



30 Lieutenants for the total Army force. I'd like to ask for your support, now more than ever, as our world class cadre work to put the final touches on the Class of 2020 and as we look forward to their commissioning in May of 2020.

I feel so very fortunate to be part of this program. I feel so fortunate to have the cadre and staff that are so invested in seeing our Cadets push themselves to excellence. I am astounded how this little corner of Wisconsin draws some of the finest Cadets across the Nation!
