## Helpful Information for Transition Planning from High School to College

1. Be active participants in your final IEP. This will make it easier to apply for college, and for special support programs such as Marquette's On Your Marq (OYM) which require information such as your present level of performance, goals, strengths, challenges, and any aptitude or career assessments done. The following information from WI Department of Public Instruction is a sample of ideas for senior year & Transition IEP:
