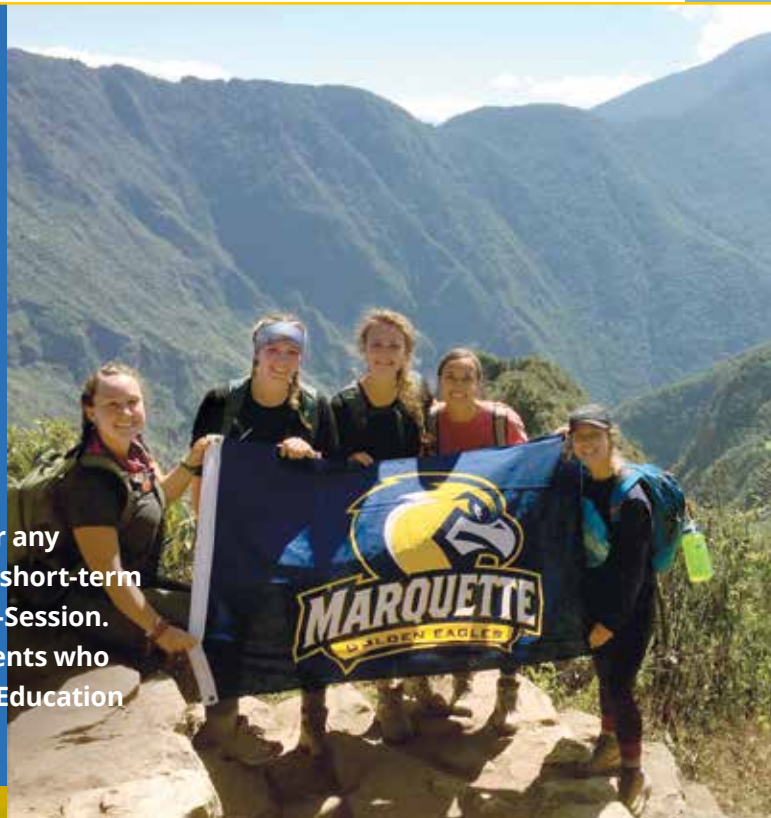


Be in the rooms where it happens

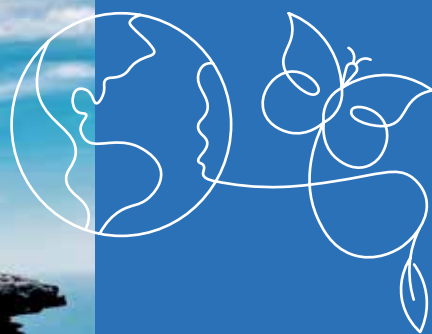
Study way, way off campus.

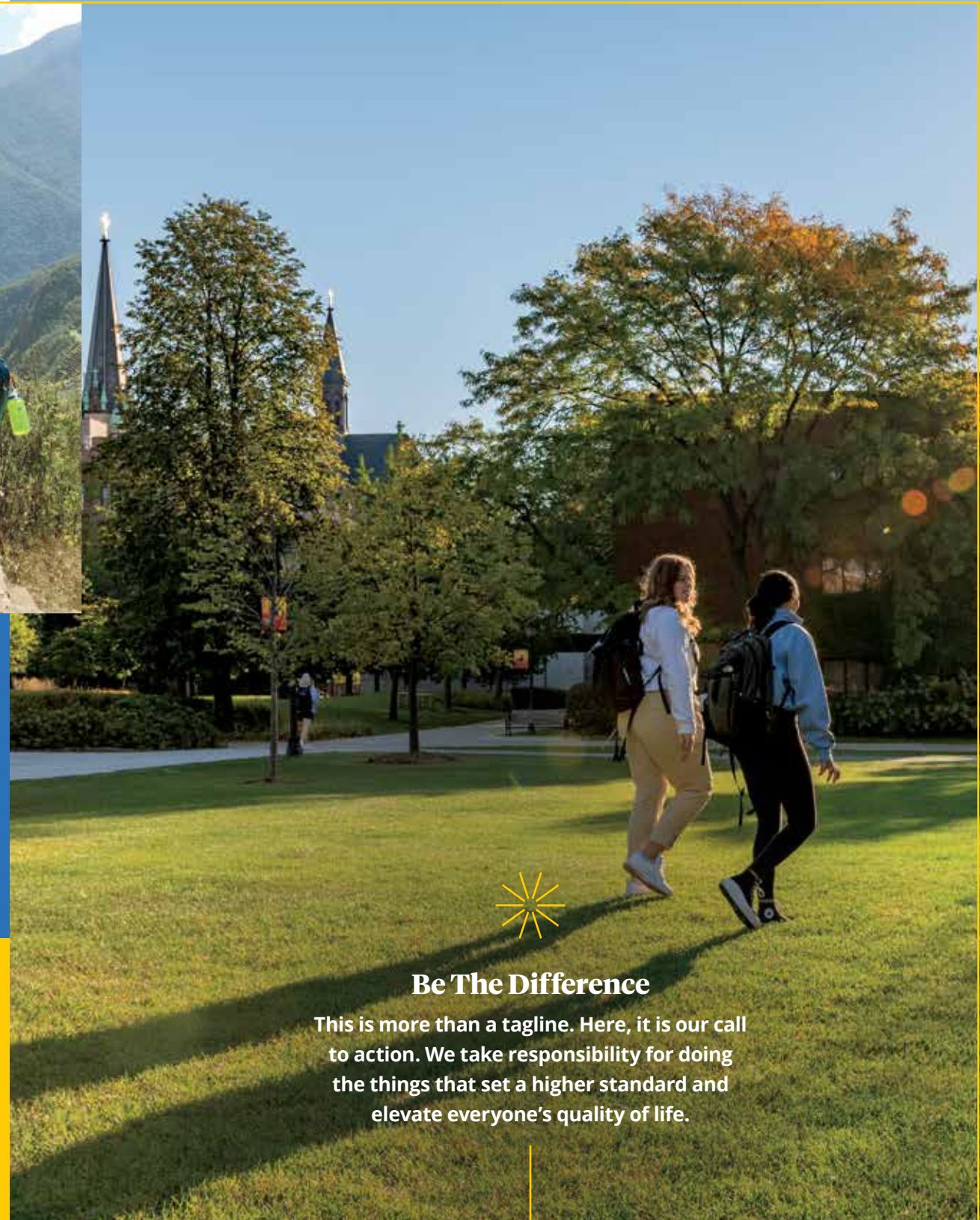


Options are (almost) unlimited
