WHAT IS THE EDUCATION PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM ?

EPP aims to provide pathways to higher learning, academic advising, holistic support, and career-building resources for incarcerated and recently released students through MU's Center of Urban Research, Teaching, and Outreach, in collaboration with partnering academic institutions and community organizations. EPP's "Outside" courses enroll a blend of degree-seeking Marquette students and students who have been formerly and/or recently released from incarceration to attend courses at Marquette University. Formerly released and/or recently released students who are accepted to take EPP courses will complete credit-bearing courses free of charge.
