Honors Study Abroad Awards

**Fall 22 Application Cycle for Spring 23 Programs
Due: October 15, 2022 | 11:59pm**

The University Honors Program will offer up to 3 study-abroad awards for Core and Disciplinary Honors students in Spring 2023 (Note: a separate application cycle will take place for for summer 2023 programs and will be due in Spring 2023). Preference will be given to applications for 5 particular study-abroad programs that Honors and the Office of International Education have designated as meeting Honors outcomes. Larger awards will be given to applicants accepted to those programs – usually \$1500 for preferred programs and \$750-1000 for non-preferred programs.
