I am the author of several dozen unrefereed articles, notes, and discussions in a variety of newsletters, journals, and popular computing magazines.

I also serve as an associate statistical consultant to DL Associates in Milwaukee, and have worked on eighteen statistical and computing projects with this firm.

Several of the publications listed above resulted from invited papers given at a variety of conferences and meetings. These include the American Philosophical Association (Delaware), the Society for the Philosophy of Sex and Love (Minnesota), the Royal Dutch Academy of Sciences (Amsterdam), the Société des Amis de Spinoza (Paris), and the Vereniging Het Spinozahuis (Amsterdam).

With Jane Layman (Univ. of Wisconsin-Milwaukee) I worked on a psychometric project for the implementation of quality circles at the Dexter-Midland Corporation (Waukegan, Illinois). The project was brought to successful completion in October of 1985. Several joint papers in psychometrics and business ethics have been presented at corporate meetings.

I am presently working with Dr. Layman on a new psychometric instrument (clinical) for assessment of cerebral palsied persons. We have done an initial test run of the survey on a client population in Chicago, and are preparing two articles on the survey structure and preliminary results.

With Dr. Layman, I completed a one-year quality-of-life project at Abbott Laboratories (North Chicago, Illinois) in January of 1989. We hope to be able to undertake a follow-up project later (1994).

I have been an invited speaker at several meetings (1987, 1988, 1989) in Illinois sponsored by local businesses and devoted to quality of life and participatory management.
