Campus Assessment Response & Education (CARE)

- Cross functional team that assesses, refers and/or responds to students identified as demonstrating signs of distress.
- Primary purpose is to ensure students are well enough to function academically and are safe to be on campus.
- Weekly meeting to discuss students of concern, using a risk rubric tool to determine next course of action/ response.
- When appropriate, students will be contacted to schedule a meeting with case manager to discuss resources and supports.
- Case manager is available for telephone and virtual appointments Monday-Friday 8:30am-4:00pm. Free to MU students.

Counseling Center

- The mental health clinic on campus is staffed by licensed generalist practitioners, who can assess/treat most mental health concerns.
- Clinic is open Monday- Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m. and is available for on call emergencies over the weekend. If there is a crisis after 4 p.m. during the week, on call counselors are available. For Fall 2020 semester, walk-in appointments have been suspended. Counseling center can be reached at 414.288.7172.
- For the Fall 2020 semester, the primary mode of therapy will be telebehavioral health, via telephone or virtual appointments. There are therapy rooms available at the counseling center, on a limited basis, for students to use during telebehavioral sessions, if they do not have access to a private space.
- Services are free to full time MU and MIAD students. Part time/non-registered students will be referred to community providers.
- For students in crisis (thoughts of self harm, harm to others or experiencing trauma) outside of business hours, contact the after hours counselor through MUPD at 414.288.6800. If you, or a student, is experiencing this situation off campus, contact 911.

Center for Psychological Services (CPS)

- Training clinic that is staffed by clinical psychology faculty and graduate students who are supervised by faculty.
- Conducts evaluations of psychological and educational problems, and with limited capacity can provide psychotherapy appointments following evaluation.
- Assessments include AHD, Autism, Depression, Anxiety, relationship problems, and academic difficulties.
- Fees are determined by ability to pay and are established during visit.
- The clinic is open for scheduled appointments. There are no walk in appointments available.
